

- Sec 4 & 5 will have 4 HBL days in Sem 1




**02**Keep it simple





#### Remedial Lessons



- To support students in their learning, remedial lessons for Sec 1 to 3 selected students will commence from T1W5.
- Various subject teachers will identify students for remediation and inform parents via Parents Gateway for the details of Time, Venue and lesson conducted.
- Students can also proactively seek their subject teachers for consultations after school.

## **Full Subject Based Banding**



- From 2021, all Secondary one students will take common curriculum & non-common curriculum subjects.
- Students will remain with their form classes when teachers conduct the common curriculum subjects such as Art, Music, PE, CCE, FCE & D & T
- Students will break out of from their form classes to attend non-common curriculum lessons based on their subject strength and interest offered at different levels.
  - G1 (Normal-Technical)
  - G2 (Normal-Academic)
  - G3 (Express)
- As a pilot school, students taking subjects at G1 and G2 levels will have opportunities to take up the subjects at a higher levels during the course of the year, based on their subject strengths and performance
